## Brief History of PPDC, Agra

The Process and Product Development Centre (PPDC), Agra, was inaugurated in 1985 through a collaborative initiative by the Government of India, the Government of Uttar Pradesh, and with the strategic support of esteemed international organizations such as the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO). The Centre was initially conceived with a focused mandate to extend technical assistance and elevate the global competitiveness of India's foundry and forging sector, which forms a vital backbone of the country's manufacturing landscape.

In recognition of the Centre's growing relevance and its strategic importance to the MSME ecosystem, PPDC was accorded autonomous status on 21st July 1986. This pivotal transformation empowered the Centre to scale its operations and expand its scope of servicePs beyond its original sectoral focus. Since attaining autonomy, PPDC has undergone sustained capacity enhancement, leading to the establishment of multiple Extension Centres across the country, to better address regional industrial requirements and nurture entrepreneurship across diverse geographies.

Today, the MSME Technology Development Centre (formerly PPDC) stands as a beacon of technological advancement and industrial facilitation. Its transition from a specialized support institution to a dynamic, multidisciplinary Technology Centre underscores a significant milestone in India's journey toward industrial modernization and MSME empowerment.
